

**F-104S ASA-M Aeronautica Militare Italiana (Italian Air Force)**

In total 246 F-104S were built, including 40 aircraft for the Turkish Air Force, and one aircraft that crashed before delivery. (MM6766 on October 1, 1971) Of the 205 F-104S for the AMI, 143 aircraft were converted to F-104S ASA.

Of these, 55 were modified to F-104S ASA-M.

Please note that the "codes" mentioned only refer to codes used during the F-104S ASA-M time, that is after the delivery from Alenia.
